

**Report of the Chairman to the Annual General Meeting
of the Hong Kong, China Rowing Association
8th December 2019**

For the Association, 2019 has been heavily dominated by the preparation and execution of the 2019 World Rowing Coastal Championships. The work of the Organising Committee was without parallel and I would like to thank everyone involved. In addition, an immense amount of the Association's resources, both staff and volunteers, have been dedicated to making this event a success and I would like to acknowledge and sincerely thank all of those who worked so hard and gave so much of their time, expertise and experience to ensure we could meet our own high expectations for the event as well as satisfying FISA, and of course our local partners, HKSARG and the Presenting Sponsor, Dah Sing Bank. The opportunity to host the event from the Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club gave us a strong and popular base for the championships.

The end result was an amazing event, perhaps the best ever World Rowing Coastal Championships, seen around the world through live television broadcasts and live streaming, with the championships run against the backdrop of Hong Kong's city skyline and working harbour.

The fact that we were able to proceed with such successful hosting of the championships when most other international events were being cancelled due to the prevailing situation in Hong Kong was, I believe, due to the nature of the event, based at RHKYC and racing on Victoria Harbour, together with strong contingency planning and situation monitoring by the Organising Committee, advised by a sub-group established for that purpose.

The undeniable success of the 2019 WRCC came at the inevitable expense of many other aspects of the Association's wide ranging responsibilities as a governing body of sport this year. However, our competition programme continued throughout the year, as did our Hong Kong Team training and competition through the HKSI, our youth development and school programmes and all other subvented activities. Even so, the Association has many other important areas of activity which need attention. Our committees have not been so active in development or promotion, in most cases due to the focus on 2019 WRCC, and there are many opportunities which are available to us but which are not currently being utilized. It will be important for the Association to address this imbalance in the coming year, to step back a little and review its priorities as governing body for rowing and carefully plan the way forward.

My comments here on what we have not done in the past year or so, should not be seen as reflecting on any of our many contributors to the Association, whether Directors, officials, volunteers or staff. As Board Chairman, I am ultimately responsible for the direction of the Association under the Board during this period and I believe it has been important for the Association to deliver a successful 2019 WRCC. Although it has placed the resources of the Association under very significant pressure, the success of the event has given the Association a very high level of credibility, particularly with government in terms of organisation, risk assessment and visibility of rowing locally and of Hong Kong internationally, both as a tourism venue and as an international destination for water

sports. I would like to stress here that this credibility is not restricted to coastal rowing and the WRCC, but will have a positive impact on all of our activities and interactions with government and related organisations.

As a priority in the coming year, the Association should consider how best to use this legacy. This will need strong and active input and involvement from all members of the Board and committees. It will also need clear long-term vision and careful short and medium-term planning. It opens up many opportunities for rowing and for the Association in Hong Kong and it will be important for the future of rowing that we take advantage of this goodwill and recognition.

I would like to highlight here the performance of our Hong Kong Team this year, the main target being the Asian Rowing Championships, held in Chungju, Korea in October. An excellent performance at this event brought 1 gold, 2 silver and 1 bronze medal in the men's lightweight double, men's lightweight quad, men's lightweight four and men's pair respectively. The gold medal in the lightweight 2x, by CHIU Hin Chun and CHAN Chi Fung, set down a strong marker ahead of the Continental Olympic Qualification Regatta that will also be held in Chungju next April. It is also very pleasing to note that 6 out of the 8 athletes winning medals in Korea were still Under 23. The women's team also reached the finals in 4 events but just missed out on medals, with two 4th place and one 5th place finishes and para athlete AJ Samuel achieved a 4th place in the PR3M1x.

Another highlight of the season came at the World Rowing U.23 Championships held in Sarasota, USA in July. After an extremely hard-fought semi-final, where four boats crossed the line in less than 2 seconds, Winne HUNG Wing Yan qualified for the A Final and ultimately finished 6th overall. This was a significant achievement considering that she is only 20 years old and racing for the first time at this level. Aside from China and one crew from Japan, Hong Kong was the only Asian team to reach a World Championships final in 2019.

Hong Kong crews also excelled at the World Rowing Coastal Championships on the home waters of Victoria Harbour, despite having had little practice in this discipline during the year. Most notably the women's 4x+ of WONG Sheung Yee, LEUNG Wing Wun, Winne HUNG and LEUNG King Wan, coxed by Pinky TSE became World Champions, whilst sisters LEE Ka Man and LEE Yuen Yin won a bronze medal in the W2x event.

Sights are now firmly set on the Asia & Oceania Olympic Continental Qualification Regatta to be held at the end of April 2020, where Hong Kong crews will aim to qualify for the Tokyo Olympic Games. Representation at the Olympics is a critical success factor at many levels for the Association and its importance should never be underestimated. I wish our Hong Kong Team - rowers, coaches and support staff, every success in this.

The international and Asian profile and role of the Association is also an important part of keeping our sport relevant, both in Hong Kong and with FISA and ARF. I was very pleased to see that Sam WONG, our Coaching Director, has recently been responsible to run a Coach Education Programme for Cambodia, based mainly on our own Hong Kong CEP syllabus. I appreciate Sam's contribution in this way to Asian Rowing as this reflects very positively on the Association's good reputation for support to ARF and FISA. In

addition, Hong Kong continues to be well represented on ARF and FISA Committees and Commissions.

For the record I have attached to this report a number of annexes, including the 2019 Competition Programme, a list of our coaches and umpires and a further list of our current Board, Committee and Commission members. As always, coaching remains the centre of all rowing activities and it is important that our coaching standards are well maintained and that the planning of our coach education programme continues to provide a good supply of well-qualified and competent coaches at all levels to match the pace of development of rowing in Hong Kong. Umpires are in the same way a central key to the competition programme. Our umpires give very generously of their time and expertise to manage competitions in all weather conditions, however harsh, and deserve our strong support. The work and standards of Hong Kong umpires at the 2019 WRCC in support of the International Jury drew many very positive comments from visiting umpires and from FISA.

Before commenting further on a number of issues which I think are facing the Association, I would like to turn very briefly to my own retirement as Chairman.

My involvement with the Association goes back to the days of the early discussions which culminated in the establishment of HKARA on 31st May 1978. The expectations of early members have been well met and also well justified in these intervening years. A range of successive coincidences over the years has led to my ongoing involvement and my rather long period as Chairman.

I am a strong supporter of age limits and term limits as they provide a valuable opportunity to renew and revitalize an organization. Things will be done differently, but this can be the value of change in ensuring a strong future for the Association and for rowing in Hong Kong.

I do have opinions on some of the values of the Association which I hope will always be closely guarded and I ask that you, as Stewards and Club Representatives who hold the final responsibility for the Association in your hands, will continue to oversee and preserve these values. I suggest that these include:

- (1) To always prioritise the interests of rowers and rowing over other interests and pressures;
- (2) volunteerism has been a central value of the Association from the beginning. It is sometimes easy to forego the value of volunteers if an organization is well staffed. HKCRA should continue to use and strongly promote and develop volunteer involvement in all its activities
- (3) good co-operation for the benefit of rowing – welcome different opinions but avoid internal splits;
- (4) individuals willing to overlook their own personal interests for the benefit of rowing as a whole.

Of course there are other important values and successive new Chairmen will have their own ideas on these. But I hope that I leave the Association in a strong position for the future and with strong potential to further enhance its reputation for good governance,

competence, dedication, volunteerism and commitment to sport and ambition for the proactive development of rowing.

I must also highlight the fact that many, many people have made the Association successful, not just today, but over all the years since I have been involved. Everyone, whether rower, official, volunteer, Director, staff or others who have been involved in rowing has individually played an important part in bringing us to where the Association is today. I believe the Association has done well to be in its current position, but I also recognize that there are many things which I leave outstanding for the incoming Chairman to consider. I believe these include:

- (1) review future financial stability - controls, sustainability, examination of potential for a revised financial model for development – viability of separation of our NSA role from the demands of Centre operation;
- (2) maintain and update the Strategic Plan objectives and targets;
- (3) indoor rowing – there are many opportunities to develop a range of competitions managed by other groups - with the Association’s role limited only to technical support - to further develop indoor rowing in the community, including schools, uniformed groups and district-based competitions up to Hong Kong Games, Corporate Games, Masters Games, etc;
- (4) Youth Development Programme – this is now being revitalised but there should be bigger opportunities for this “*face of Hong Kong rowing*” both in our outreach and also in terms of sponsorship and profile;
- (5) promotion and PR – we need a more proactive strategy to promote rowing in the community. The WRCC gave us an insight into the possibilities, the value and the potential;
- (6) introduction of rowing to retired and older people to support life-long health and fitness and to optimize the use of equipment and facilities in low-peak periods;
- (7) tracking of boat use from our Centres – as Centres are filled with boats it becomes more important to know the level of use of every boat and to develop strategies around this;
- (8) university rowing – examine the current model in conjunction with the universities themselves to see if it is the best approach in the face of financial and other sustainability pressures;
- (9) club rowing – re-energise club rowing as the basis of our development strategies to intake and encourage new rowers;
- (10) para rowing – Hong Kong again sent a small para team to the Sydney International Regatta, but there is still a gap in the Association’s para rowing activities and our involvement in the para athlete community. I am sure that more can be done to make rowing more inclusive in this area;
- (11) coastal rowing development, including tour rowing, new venues and organisations, SUPs, the ATIR and others.

This is a long list and is by no means exhaustive. If we are to continue to make progress, these and other areas will need committed volunteers and leaders to carefully decide the priorities and to eventually make real progress and take the Association to the next levels of development. I am confident that this can be done.

Our Honorary Life President, Bob Wilson, has reminded me of the importance of maintaining archives and historical records of the Association and its activities, to ensure our history is not lost. I will discuss further with Bob to make a recommendation to the incoming Board of Directors in this regard.

In closing this report, and my term as Chairman, I am very pleased to announce to you that the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust has agreed to fund the Sha Tin Rowing Centre Extension project. Work has already begun with an Architect appointed and a works programme extending over a 48-month period. Copies of the current proposed extension plans are displayed on the board at the back for your information. Please let us know if you have any comments or suggestions. This is a major step for the Association, with STRC designed for a previous age over 40 years ago and with rowing now having outgrown the original planning. We will have further opportunities to thank the Jockey Club, but I would like to acknowledge here their trust in supporting the Association's further development.

On behalf of the Association I would also like to record my usual thanks to the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China, the Home Affairs Bureau and the Leisure & Cultural Services Department for their support during this past year and specifically to Marine Department for their support and advice on racing in Victoria Harbour. I would also like to again recognize and appreciate the importance of our cooperative relationship with the Hong Kong Sports Institute and the SI Rowing professional coaching team who have continued to make a very significant contribution to the work of the Association.

Thank you to our Board members for your strong support to the Association and to me. Thank you also to all Committee and Commission members for your good work.

And thank you also to Annie Lam and the staff of the Association for your strong support over the past extraordinarily busy year.

After such a long period sitting in this seat there are without doubt many, many things I have left unsaid, both about the Association as well as to many of you here who have, between you, contributed so many years to the development of rowing in Hong Kong.

May I just say a very sincere THANK YOU to you all.
